**PROJECT NAME:** Outdoor Sampling Area

**PROJECT LOCATION:** Baseball diamond in the back portion of the parking lot. The parking lot is located across the street from the Stevens Point Brewery at 2617 Water Street in Stevens Point.

PROJECT DATE: Monday, June 14, 2021

#### **PROJECT OVERVIEW:**

The Stevens Point Brewery is looking to bring tours back with a new sampling area setup. Previously, our sampling area was housed inside the brewery's courtyard. Due to our brewery's expansion project, the space in the courtyard is no longer available.

The new sampling area would be placed outside the brewery in the baseball diamond. This space would be utilized for all brewery guests that would like to drink any of our products: Point beer, Point soda, Ciderboys hard cider, Whole Hog beer, and Tea Runner hard iced tea.

The outdoor sampling area would be open through the summer months, starting in June, and extended through fall, weather permitting.

#### **BUILDING DETAILS:**

A building will be constructed in a similar style as a food concession stand. Brewery guests would order from employees working inside the building and then would sit down in the baseball diamond with various seating options available. The building will require electricity and water.

#### **Building Dimensions:**

The building will approximately be sized 18 feet long, 8 feet wide, and 8 feet tall.


## Building Interior:

Our brews will be available on tap through a cooler 12-tap system that is approximately 8 feet long and 2 feet wide. All product brands would be also available in a fridge, approximately 2 feet wide, in glass bottles and aluminum cans (see Questions in **Concluding Notes**).

A sink will be placed inside for handwashing (see <u>Questions</u> in **Concluding Notes**). The remainder of the interior would be dedicated to storage space. Our storage would house cleaning supplies, merchandise available for sale, and products to drink off premise.

- Cleaning Supplies
  - Hanging Closet for broom and map.
  - Shelving to house disinfectant, cleaning rags, floor cleaner, soap, and paper towel.
  - First Aid Kit station.
- Merchandise
  - Hats and shirts hung for display.
  - Shelving to store excess hats and shirt sizes.
  - If any food is sold, it would be prepackaged such as chips and trail mix. No food will be made on site.
- Products
  - o 6 Pack bottles and 12 pack cans stored in shelving for purchasing to take home.
  - o Growlers stored for fills from the tap to take home. Growlers would be washed beforehand utilizing the sink and would be properly sealed.

Please note, only employees would be allowed inside the building; customers will not be allowed access inside. See below for a diagram of the inside.



## **Building Exterior:**

The front of the building, where customers purchase from, would be a large open window with a counter. The window would pop-open and act as an overhang to provide some shade for customers as they order. The overhang would be able to close and lock at night. The counter would extend inside the building and outside the building. Inside the counter would provide space for a register system. Outside the counter would allow placement of any drinks for the customers to grab.

The sides of the building would both have windows in a drop-down style to create a breeze, no air conditioning will be in the building, and keep with the open design. Both windows would be locked at night. One of the sides would have a half-door below the window and a small ramp to allow easy access for bringing in kegs.

All windows will also have built-in screens.

## **LOCATION DETAILS:**

The outdoor sampling area will revive Brewery Park. The shape of the sampling area would match the baseball diamond. Signage from Brewery Park will be recreated. The baseball atmosphere will be restored with ordering at home plate and signage in the outfield.

The fencing currently around the baseball diamond would be extended into the outfield and enclosed. One main gate will be made for entry from the parking lot. Another larger gate will be put in place to allow food trucks easy access to the interior. Several gates will be around the perimeter for emergency exits. All exits would have signage of "No Alcohol beyond this Point."

Various seating styles will be available in the baseball diamond.

- Picnic tables with umbrellas.
- Barrel tables for stand-up seating.
- A more covered option utilizing pop-up utility tents or a custom baseball dugout design for inclement weather.

Various outdoor games would be inside the baseball diamond.

- Cornhole
- Spikeball
- Ladder Toss
- Giant Jenga

Garbage cans will be spread throughout the baseball diamond. A porta potty will be available in the baseball diamond along with the bathroom available in the Gift Shop. Security cameras would be put in place.




The sampling area will approximately be 110 feet by 75 feet.














#### **SAMPLING AREA DETAILS:**

## <u>Proposed Hours of Operation:</u>

The sampling area would be open 7 days a week from the approximate time of 11am to 9pm. The hours would be reflected in the Gift Shop.

## Foot Traffic Estimation:

In the past, we offered 5 tours a day, capped at 25 people per tour. Taking this into account along with an estimated amount of traffic that did not go on the tours, we approximate foot traffic at 200 people. To help create a better flow of traffic, we propose to offer 7 tours, capped at 15 people per tour, taking place on the hour from 12pm to 6pm.

Many brewery guests in the past would often want to drink and not go on a tour as they are looking for a tap room atmosphere. Having the sampling area in the baseball diamond would help minimize foot traffic as those who would want to only drink, do not need to cross the street to the Gift Shop. Approximately, 25% of the foot traffic would not cross the street.

## **CONCLUDING NOTES:**

We are very excited for the opportunity to create an outdoor sampling area that creates a new experience for people living and visiting the Stevens Point Area and brings the Brewery Park back to life. Please let us know what the City of Stevens Point would need to make this idea reality. We are flexible with what the city needs.

- Does the city prefer if we offer glass bottles, aluminum cans, and/or plastic cups to customers?
   All beverage formats would remain in the enclosed sampling area, but do any formats need to stay inside the constructed building and not handed out to brewery guests?

Subject: Ordinance Amendment - Notice of Appeal

The Administrative Appeals Board was created in December 2019. The Board has met several times since being established and discovered a couple of areas needing clean up. The Board typically meets the third Wednesday of the month. Depending on when the appeal is received and the time it takes for staff to review, it is not always possible to hold a hearing within thirty days of receiving the appeal and remain consistent with meeting on the third Wednesday of the month. For this reason, the proposed amendment to change "thirty (30) days to a reasonable time" is before you. Another reason for this amendment is the Administrative Appeals Board prefers to meet when there is more than just one appeal which requires additional time to receive more appeals. The second proposed amendment to this ordinance is to add that the appellant shall be notified in writing "by either email or physical mail" so that the appellant can be notified by email if preferred rather than physically mailing their notice.

Thank you for considering these amendments to Chapter 3.56 – Administrative Appeals Board, Notice of Appeal.

## ORDINANCE AMENDING THE REVISED MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF STEVENS POINT, WISCONSIN

The Common Council of the City of Stevens Point, do ordain as follows:

**SECTION I.** Section 3.56 of the Municipal Code of the City of Stevens Point, is hereby amended to read as follows:

3.56 (6)(b)1. Notice of Appeal. The written determination may be appealed to the Administrative Review Board if the person aggrieved files a written notice of appeal within thirty (30) days after he/she receives the determination. Such notice shall be filed with the City Clerk. The Board shall hold a hearing within thirty (30) days a reasonable time after the notice is filed with the Clerk. The appellant shall be notified in writing by either email or physical mail of the time, date, and location of the hearing at least ten (10) days before the hearing.

**SECTION II:** This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication, as provided by law.
